



## GETTING THE MOST OUT OF CARESEARCH: FAVORITES AND SHORTCUTS

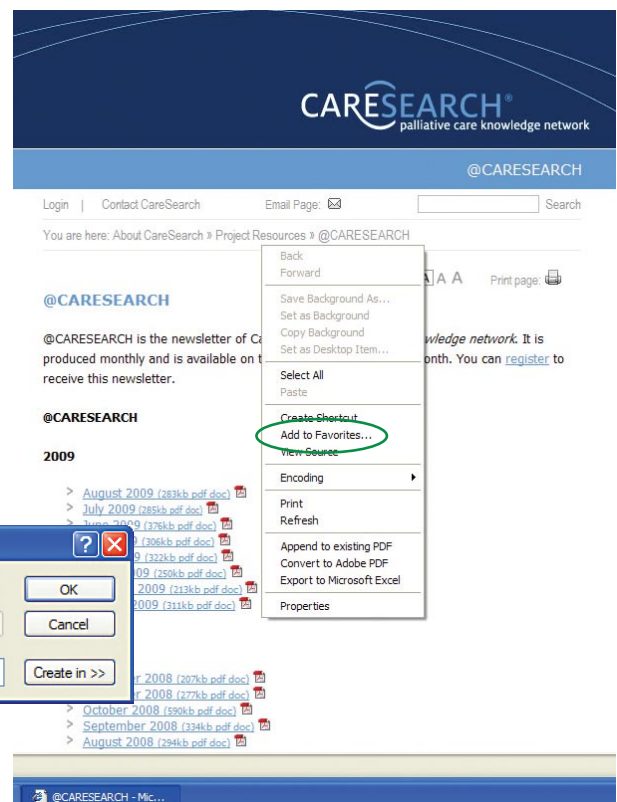
When you find a website or web page that is very useful and you want to make sure you can find it again, it can be handy to save it.

### Create a Favourite or Bookmark

Bookmarks or Favorites are web addresses that have been saved on your computer so you can visit the site again easily. Different browsers have different names for these. Microsoft Internet Explorer calls them Favourites, while Mozilla Firefox browser calls them Bookmarks. If you are using Internet Explorer to add a web page to your Favourites list go to the webpage you want to save and click your right mouse button. A list will display on your screen. Select the one called Add to Favourites.

Add a name to your new Favourite (or accept the one automatically generated) Click OK.

Another way of doing this is to hold down Ctrl and D on your keyboard.

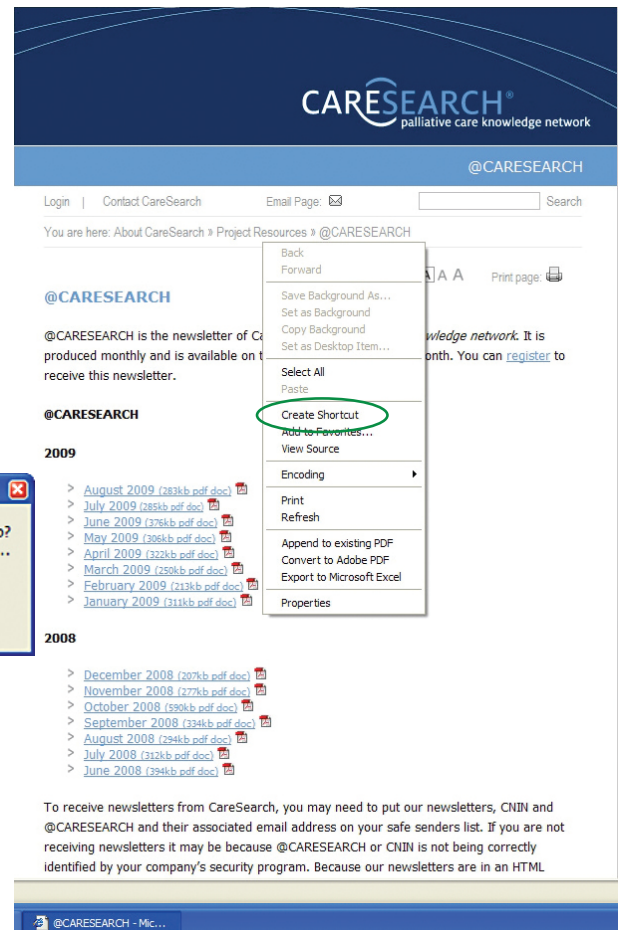
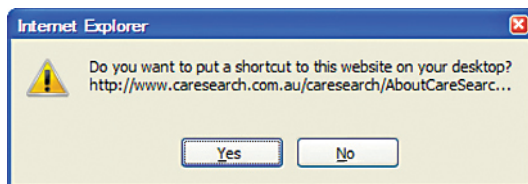


### Save to desktop

If you use CareSearch all the time you can Save CareSearch (or a favourite page within CareSearch) to your desktop. This means the website icon will appear on the screen of your computer much like internet explorer or the recycle bin.

To create a desktop shortcut, go to the webpage you wish to save. Right click your mouse. Select Create shortcut from the list, then click yes.

You now have this page linked as a shortcut on your desktop.
