There are over 900 content pages in CareSearch so knowing how to find the information you need is important.

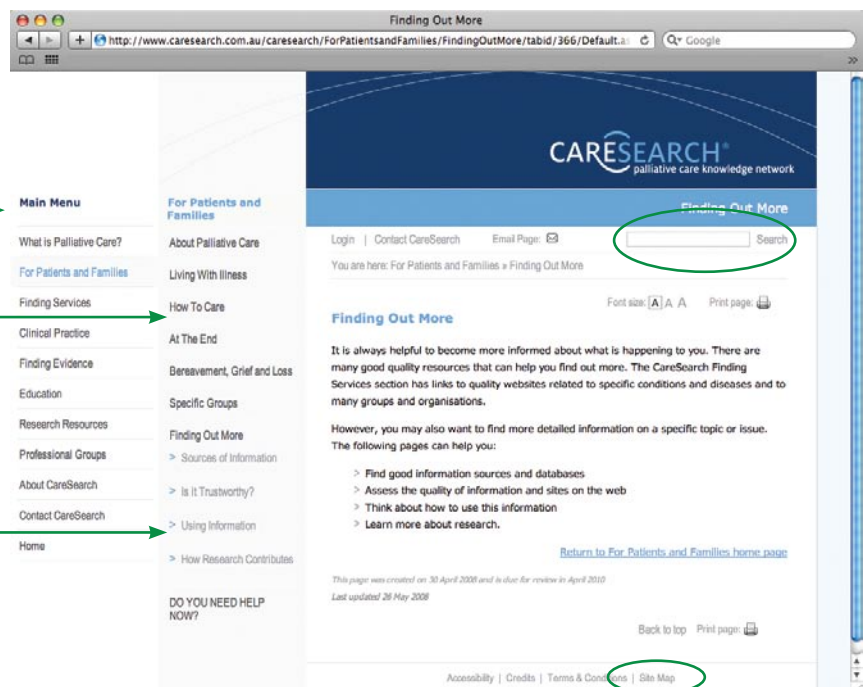
Understanding the side bar menu

CareSearch uses a double menu system. The left hand menu bar is always fixed while the internal menu bar changes depending on which section you are in. If you get lost, clicking on the word Home will return you to the home page.

On the left hand side of the screen you will find two menu columns. The far left outside menu relates to the nine major sections within the website.

Clicking on one of these choices will open up that particular section. The inside menu relates to the section that you are currently viewing, with the title of the section above the menu. New pages or sets of pages are then displayed.

A third set of page choices can be seen underneath the main cluster pages in the internal menu bar.



Using the Site Map

The [site map](#) provides you with a list of every page that is found in the website. It lays out the structure of the website. If you scroll down the list, clicking on the topic of interest will take you to that webpage or resource.

You can access the site map by clicking on the words Site Map which are found at the bottom of every page in the website.

Search function

You can use the search box at the top right of the web page to put in a term to describe what you are looking for. For example, you may be looking for pain resources. Type in "pain". Then click Search. A new page will pop up containing links to pages within CareSearch that are relevant to pain. Clicking on a link will take you to that page.
