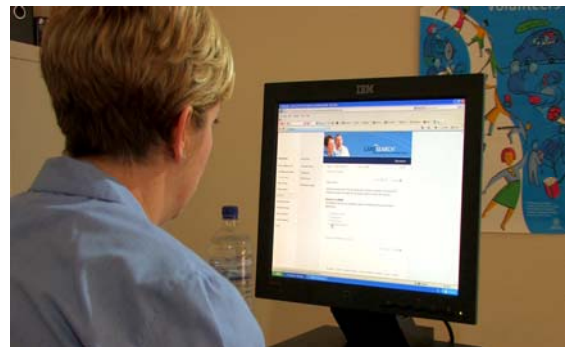


CARESEARCH PAGE PROFILE: CARESEARCH TRAINING MODULES (CNIN FEBRUARY 2010)
