Study Title: The development of a model of care for Haematology and Palliative Care			
Brief description of the study: The project builds on a program of research initiated by NH&MRC post-doctoral fellowship examining issues in relation to haematology. The prior research documented problems at the interface of cure and palliation in haematology from the consumer's perspective. The present study seeks to address the problems caused by the lack of integration of palliative care in haematology through the development of an effective model of care for palliation in this diagnostic category. The present project seeks to build a model of care based on consultation with a multi-disciplinary range of professionals through in-depth interviews and surveys, and consumers through case studies. The outcome will be a thoroughly researched model for integrating palliative care into haematology that includes both the professional and consumer perspective and address the central questions - 1.
