**Study Title: Improving medication management of palliative care patients: Enhancing the role of community pharmacists**

**Brief description of the study:** Community pharmacists are amongst the most readily accessible health professionals and have the potential to contribute to the management of palliative care patients in the community. Most pharmacists, however, do not have the knowledge and confidence to contribute optimally in this area. This study aimed to develop and evaluate an educational program in palliative cancer care for Australian community pharmacists that would address educational needs and thereby improve their knowledge and confidence in the area. Following identification of pharmacists' educational needs using an iterative research process, an online educational program in palliative cancer care was developed. This involved module writing (including case studies and activities) and review by various palliative care and educational experts, transference of the developed materials to a web site on the Internet, and production of a CD-ROM. The flexible design and delivery of the program was shown to be successful, as pharmacists accessed it from anywhere at a time convenient to them, and participants engaged extensively with the material by submitting responses to the notice board activities. Following completion of the educational program, pharmacists perceived their knowledge and confidence in palliative cancer care to have increased and they were better able to communicate with palliative care patients and carers.
