End-of-Life Care Clinical Model Project

Metro South Palliative Care Service (MSPCS) and [Brisbane South Primary Health Network](#) (BSPHN) are partnering in an initiative that will support residential aged care facilities (RACFs) to provide high-quality end-of-life care for residents and their families.

Project activities:

Project activities will target the facility and clinical care provider domains of the RACF environment.

Facility level

Activity include:

- a 3-day, face-to-face, in-facility mentorship program. This flexible program will cover advance care planning, End-of-Life Care (EoLC) and sustainable practice.
- two exciting one-day conferences will be held for nurses in RACFs in the BSPHN area all interested staff will have the opportunity to participate in this at no cost to the facility.
- a dedicated website for RACF nurses to support quality end-of-life care to residents
- access to online education modules; educational videos and interactive educational tools aimed at improving EoLC.

Clinical Providers of Care level

Activity include:

- Advance Care Planning and End-of-Life Care templates and example policies and procedures documents facility managers able to be modified and embedded within their facility.
- developing facility brochures for interested family and/or friends covering EoLC and ACP topics.
- quality assurance processes including establishing palliative approach working parties and supporting education and training in EoLC and ACP.

Who can participate?

This program will partner with RACFs in the BSPHN area. Participating facilities must have twenty-four hour onsite nursing cover and internet access for nursing staff.

Expected benefits

The expected benefits are improved quality end-of-life care for residents and their families resulting in improved resident, family and staff satisfaction with care and increased numbers of residents dying in their place of choice.
