Everyone has a role in palliative care

Palliative care is about improving quality of life for individuals and the family, carers and friends who are supporting them as they come to the end of their life. Every year, more than 160,000 people will die and many of these will be expected deaths where the person knows they are coming to the end of their life.

Each person's needs are different.
Family and friends, health professionals, aged care staff, and others in our community all have a role to play in providing care and support. To be able to care, people need access to relevant quality information. CareSearch provides evidence, information and

# I am a family member and provide care

- Families and friends provide vital support to someone with palliative care needs.
- This can involve emotional and physical care as well as practical support.
- Our booklet outlines what you need to know.

#### I am a GP

- GPs are a first point of contact for many people with palliative care needs.
- GPs care for people in the community and in aged care and connect their patients with many health and community services.
- CareSearch has tools, patient materials, and <u>key points</u> to help you support your patients.

# I am an allied health professional

- Allied health professionals care for people with palliative care needs in specialist palliative care settings, acute and subacute inpatient settings and in the community and residential aged care facilities.

- All nurses will be involved with providing care to people coming to the end of their life regardless of their practice setting. So all nurses need some palliative care knowledge and skills.
