 - Case consults

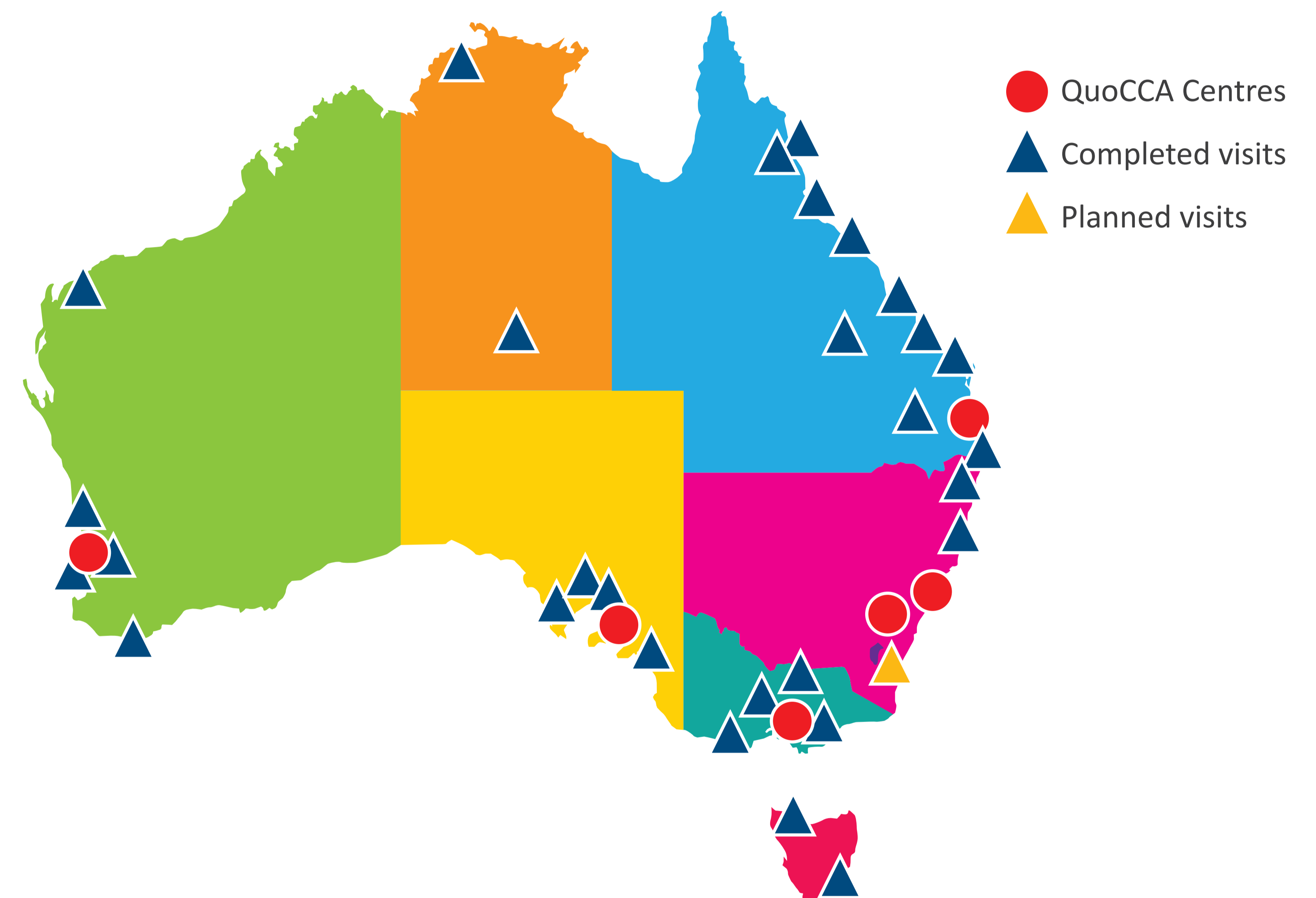
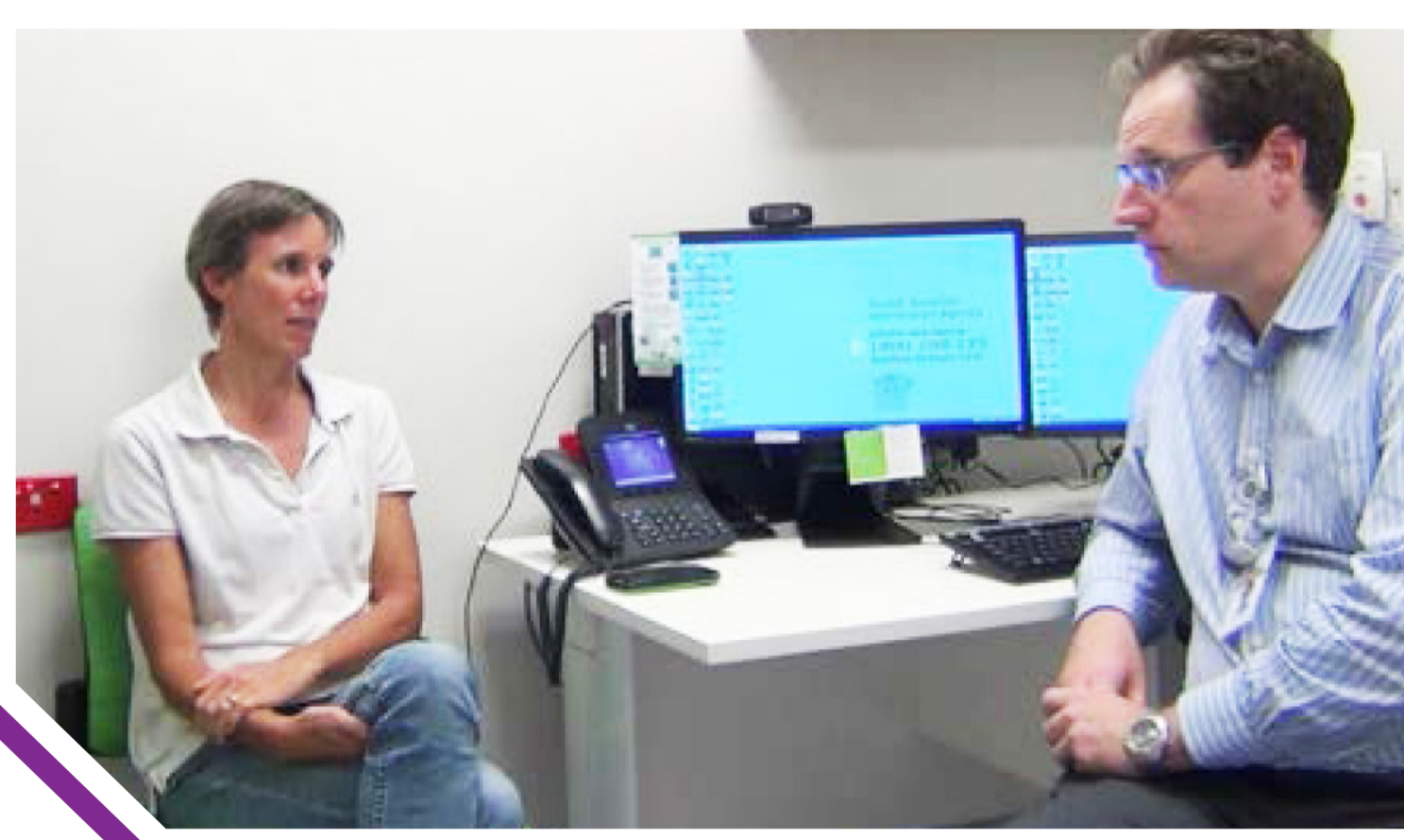


Learning Needs Analysis
